



CHOCOLATE BOOKING GAME

Supplies Needed: Hershey Miniature Candy Bars
Tray
Small Labels

Game Set-Up: Label approximately 30 Hershey candy bars with “P” for party or a picture of yourself, “\$5” for five dollar gift certificate. Note that most or all of your “P’s” should be on the **colored** candy bars, **not** the brown ones!! Most people will choose the candy bars with the bright colored labels. Label one candy bar with a “FREE” (piece of collector’s jewelry). Place all candy bars on the tray.

Game Instructions: Tell your guests that _____ (hostess’ name) needs their help. She needs at least two bookings in order to get the most free jewelry, but we’re going to shoot for three because you’ve promised her something very special if she gets three bookings this evening (I usually use a collector’s piece of jewelry or gift certificate for her “something special”). **“C” stands for Chocolate, most women like chocolate next to accessorizing. This is a game and you do not have to play. Some of the chocolates have \$5 on them, one (1) chocolate has a Free (which means that you will get a free piece of jewelry out of my bag), and some of the chocolates have my picture on them. Honestly, that is the best prize of them all because you won me! The worst thing that is going to happen is you will have to earn a lot o FREE jewelry! When I come around I'm going to have you take three (3) chocolates if you choose to play, if you get more than one \$5 you will get up to \$10 off your order tonight, and if you get more than one picture you only have to have one party. The only rule I have is if you are willing to play, you have to be willing to party!**

Walk around with your tin, offering it to everyone and make sure to make a big deal about the gift certificates if they are drawn and to remind them that the retired piece of jewelry is still in there!!

Note: You may have to adjust how many candy bars are in your tin if you have a large number of people at a show, so make sure that you have extras on hand that you can add in if needed.

Remember, this is your game, which means your rules!
